RECOGNITION IS GIVEN TO ATHLETES WHO MAKE A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTION TO THE SPORT OF GYMNASTICS OVER A PERIOD OF YEARS. A GYMNAST WHO ACCUMULATES 30 POINTS OR OVER DURING THEIR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIVE YEARS QUALIFIES FOR GOLD RECOGNITION. A GYMNAST ACCUMULATING 20 OR MORE POINTS IS AWARDED SILVER RECOGNITION WITH A GYMNAST COUNTING 10 OR MORE POINTS RECEIVING BRONZE RECOGNITION.

THE GCG POINT SYSTEM IS BASED ON A NUMBER OF FACTORS INCLUDING OLYMPIC, COMMONWEALTH, PAN AMERICAN, WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP AND FOUR CONTINENTS TEAMS, CANADIAN CHAMPIONS, PARTICIPATION AT INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS AND ATHLETE CARDING.
